NFCH observes Communal Harmony Campaign and Fund Raising Week every year from 19th to 25th November and the last working day of the week is observed as Flag Day. The objectives of Communal Harmony Campaign Week are to raise donations for the physical & psychological support of the children affected by various kind of societal violence and to carry out activities as per the mandate. NFCH prints and distributes publicity materials i.e. Posters, Wrappers, Flag Stickers, Letters, Pamphlets etc. to educational institutions, universities, central public sector undertakings, para-military organizations, States/UTs, Ministries / Departments, and embassies & missions abroad, etc. every year.

Communal Harmony Campaign Week & Flag Day 2018

In addition to various programmes organized across the country for celebration of Communal Harmony Campaign Week & Flag Day 2018 from 19th-25th November 2018, the Flag Day was observed on 22nd November 2018.

A group of Six children, two from Jammu & Kashmir and one each from Gujarat, Manipur, Bihar and Chhattisgarh were invited by the Foundation to Delhi to participate in Communal Harmony Campaign Week & Flag Day celebrations from 19th to 25th of November 2018. 22 children, being assisted by the Foundation under Project "Assist" from Jammu & Kashmir, Gujarat, Assam, Bihar and Chhattisgarh were invited to Delhi during the week. Several in house/outdoor activities like *Sarva Dharm Sambhav* prayer, medical health checkup, Microsoft session, sports activities, yoga sessions, Nukad Natak, Atal Tinkering Lab tour, STEM concepts, etc were organized for participants. These children were also taken to Dilli Haat, Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) headquarter, IIT Delhi, Qutub Minar, Swaminarayan Akshardham Temple, Raj Ghat, Lal Quila, Jama Masjid, Gurudwara Bangla Sahib, Bahai House of Worship, Rashtrapati Bhavan, Parliament House and National War Memorial. They also participated in a live television programme 'New India- Sankalp' at Doordarshan Kendra, New Delhi.
